

APPLES

Akane: Medium sized, bright red apple with white firm juicy flesh that is slightly tart. Moderate scab and mildew resistance. Dessert quality.

Beni Shogun: At last- a Fuji that ripens consistently for cool Summer climate gardens! Keeps until March. Intensely sweet and crisp. Moderate resistance to scab.

Cosmic Crisp: Red, juicy apple. Perfect sweetness and tartness. Excellent fresh apple, flavor gets better with age. Exceptional storage apple. Sold ONLY in Washington.

Early Pink Lady: Fine grained, white fleshed. Very crisp with a sweet-tart flavor. Excellent for fresh eating, baking, and freezing. Flavor improves with storage.

Enterprise: Medium sized, dark-red apples that are perfect for cooking or eating fresh. Apple scab immune. Resistant to Fire Blight.

Gala: A blend of modern and old-fashioned parentage. Matures with bright red stripes over a yellow background. Firm, juicy and fine textured. Sweet with a slight tartness.

Gravenstein: Large, crisp, and juicy! Known for their excellent flavor and thin skin. Great for fresh eating, pies, ciders, sauces, desserts and more.

Honeycrisp: Excellent storage. Large, bright green and red striped apples. Sweet with a slight tartness. Grows well in cool climates and stores well. Great fresh or in desserts.

King: Large apple with yellow skin and red stripes. Crisp and sweet. Good storage apple. Enjoy fresh or baked into your favorite desserts.

Liberty: Disease resistant! Red, crunchy, mildly tart and highly productive. Great for eating fresh, juicing and sauces.

Pink Pearl: Medium sized, yellow apple with red blush on skin and pink flesh inside. Crisp and juicy with a tart to sweet-tart taste.

September Ruby: *Full sized apple tree* with medium sized apples. Red apples with light-green flesh. Excellent fresh or cooked. Vigorous grower. Stores well.

Spartan: Dark-red, crisp, and excellent flavor. Good storage and highly prolific producer.

Zestar: Excellent sweet and tart balance with a slight hint of brown sugar flavor. Crisp and juicy. Early ripening and cold hardy. Fantastic storage.

Scarlet Sentinel (Colunade): Large yellow apples with a red blush. Juicy, sweet and an excellent keeper. Grows upward in a column shape.

Urban Blushing Delight (Colunade): Blush red to yellow. Pollinates Urban Tasty Red. Crisp and sweet. Grows upward in a column shape.

Urban Tasty Red (Colunade): Red, medium sized fruit that is sweet and juicy. Pollinates Urban Blushing Delight. Grows upward in a column shape.

PEARS

Anjou: Medium to large sized pears. Excellent keeper. Green skin. Sweet flavor with a hint of citrus. Enjoy fresh or baked.

Ari Rang (Oriental): Large, brown-skinned pear. Very crisp, sweet and juicy. Late to ripen. Firm flesh allows long term storage in cool location.

Bartlett: Medium to large very sweet and tender fruit. Great to enjoy fresh and an ideal pear for canning.

Nijisseiki (Oriental): Medium sized, round fruit. Green to yellow in color. Firm, crisp and juicy. Known for their high-quality taste.

Orcas: Large, flavorful and scab resistant. Yellow fruit with red blush. Vigorous grower and very prolific. Great for canning, drying or eating fresh.

Rescue: Yellow fruit with bright orange blush. Sweet, smooth and very juicy. Small core makes it an excellent canning pear, but they can also be enjoyed fresh off the tree.

Shinseiki (Oriental): Juicy, sweet, refreshing and crisp like an apple. Easy to grow. Stores well. Bright yellow skin. Vigorous growth and heavy bearing.

QUINCE

Orange Quince: Large, bright yellow fruit turns shades of red when cooked. Pear shaped fruits are flavorful and aromatic. Loves the cold! Self-pollinating.

NUTS

Hall's Hardy Almond: A hardy and heavy producing almond with large nuts and hard shells. Late producer. Self-pollinating.

Carpathian Walnut: English variety. High quality nut. Full flavor with a hint of butterscotch flavor. Self-pollinating.

Sacajawea Filbert: Resistant to Eastern fire blight. Heavy producer. Flavorful nuts great for roasting, baking and eating fresh. Cross pollinates with Yamhill.

Yamhill Filbert: Very productive new variety from Oregon. Large and delicious nuts. Immune to Eastern fire blight. Cross pollinates with Sacajawea.

CHEERRIES

Black Gold: Beautiful, glossy and sweet. Late blooming to avoid Spring frosts. Bears a heavy crop of deep red fruit that is crack resistant. Self-pollinating.

Crimson Passion: Grown on their own root system. Dark red fruit. Tart flavor, but not too tart for fresh eating. Self-pollinating. One of the sweetest sour cherries.

Glacier: Large and dark red fruit. Crack resistant. Cherries are full of flavor and on the sweeter side. Self-pollinating.

Lapin: Excellent quality and rich flavor. Fruit is large, firm and bright red. Crack resistant, cold hardy, and a heavy producer. Self-pollinating.

Montmorency: A popular commercial tart cherry. Small, bright red fruit with clear yellow flesh. Early bearing. Soft and juicy. Self-pollinating.

Rainier: Yellow skin with a pink blush. Low acidity makes it best for fresh eating. Early producer and excellent for storage. Needs a pollinator.

Stella: Large, heart shaped, dark red fruit. Sweet and juicy. Ideal for a home orchard. Moderate crack resistance. Self-pollinating.

Vandelay: Large, dark red (almost black) fruit. Crack and canker resistant. Developed in Canada. Self-pollinating.

BUSH CHERRIES

Carmine Jewel (Bush): Dark red cherries with a tart flavor. Excellent for use in juice, fresh eating, pies, and more. Self-pollinating but produces more with a pollinator.

Juliet (Bush): Large, deep red cherries with a rich, complex flavor of sweetness and tartness. Self-pollinating but produces more with a pollinator.

Romeo (Bush): Large fruit and small pits make Romeo a fan favorite. Sweet, tart cherry with crimson skin. High yielding. Self-pollinating but produces more with a pollinator.

PLUMS

Beauty: Japanese plum. Red-purple skin with amber flesh. Sweet to sweet-tart in flavor. Self-pollinating.

Italian Prune: Medium to large fruit with dark purple skin and yellow flesh. Sweet flavor with a hint of citrus. Self-pollinating.

Satsuma: Japanese plum. Medium sized fruit with dark red skin. Solid plum with a sweet flavor. Needs a pollinator.

Shiro: Japanese plum. Large, round, golden yellow fruit with yellow flesh. Mild sweet flavor. Can produce on their own but best with a pollinator.

Yellow Egg: European plum. Heavy producer of large, oval, freestone, golden yellow fruit that has a honey-like taste. Excellent for dessert or canning. Self-pollinating.

PEACHES

Frost: A flavorful, yellow fleshed peach that is excellent for canning or eating fresh. Leaf curl resistant. Self-pollinating.

Pix-Zee Miniature: Large, delicious, yellow fruit with red and orange skin. Vigorous grower up to 6 feet tall. Full sized fruit on a mini tree! Self-pollinating.

APRICOTS

Harglow: Medium to large fruit. Perfect for eating fresh. Attractive orange skin and sweet, flavorful flesh. High resistance to disease. Self-pollinating.
